SKILL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS



During the months of September and October, a series of skill development workshops were conducted for the second-year Liberal Arts students at Christ University, focusing on essential professional competencies. These sessions aimed to equip students with tools for practical navigating the competitive job market and improving personal and professional branding, with a specific emphasis on communication, anxiety management, resume building, and LinkedIn optimization.

The workshops began with a focus on communication skills, addressing public and speaking anxiety impromptu thinking. Through interactive activities, participants learned to manage anxiety by reframing it as normal and embracing it through dialogue-based communication. Key exercises, such as shouting the wrong name to break mental barriers and practicing tongue twisters to improve speech fluidity, were introduced to aid students in thinking on their feet and reducing public speaking anxiety.

Another key session focused on resume development. Students were introduced to the BANE format (Brief, Achievementsfocused, Neatly-organized, and Errorfree), emphasizing the importance of structuring resumes concisely while highlighting both technical and soft skills. Participants were encouraged to use achievements to provide quantifiable concrete evidence of their contributions and to regularly update their resumes to align with evolving career goals. In the concluding sessions, the focus shifted to optimizing LinkedIn profiles. Students learned the value of professional profile pictures, the psychological impact of color choices for banners, and how to craft an engaging "About" section as an elevator pitch.

The importance of customizing LinkedIn URLS and using industry-relevant keywords in headlines to improve searchability was also highlighted. Additionally, participants were guided on the benefits of skill endorsements and recommendations for enhancing their credibility and visibility to recruiters. These workshops provided students with critical insights and practical skills necessary for successful professional development, including communication, digital branding, and job application strategies.
