INDUSTRIAL VISIT - COCA COLA

21st December 2022



The industrial visit on 21st December 2022 with the MBA students of first and second years started by 8:30 from the campus to Bidadi. The students count included 55 in number along with a faculty Dr. Aishwarya N, Academic Coordinator of SBMA, BGR Campus. The entry time inside Hindustan Coca Cola was exactly 10:30 am. The students were divided into a count of 27–30 each in a group. There were 2 guides, Ms. Hima (Procurement Manager) and Ms. Ambika (Micro-biologist) who explained the entire Supply Chain and Operations of Coca-Cola. The process started from water purification where the stages of it were pressurized sand filtration, activated carbon filter and micron level purification. The bottles meanwhile were washed and inspected by manual checking and machine inspections.

The washing of the bottles included caustic wash, chlorine wash and carbon-di-oxide wash for returnable glass bottles in a separate (RGB) Line. The prepared drink is filled, crowned, inspected, coded with date and then shipped. This was the crisp explanation of their supply chain management. The various lines that we visited were PET Line, RGB Line and Kombi Line (Filling + Rinsing) and Smart water Line. The management followed TPM process, six sigma, Kaizan for processing and quality check. The BIS and FSSAI standards were followed for Quality Assurance. The plant had both outsourced manufacturing and in-house manufacturing for various products like Minute Maid, Maaza, Coca-Cola, Georgia, Kinley, Sprite, Thumbs-up, Fanta and Limca. The various teams in the plant were Maintenance, Shipping, Admin, Quality, Production and Store. The water management was based on the tagline of "Water Act Treasure Economics" and the plant followed the 3 R's of "Reduce, Recycle and Replenish". The entire organization had separate distributed heads to take up the leads of distribution channels and the entire system was connected with the ERP system that includes the entire chain from procurement till distribution. The entire visit was for 2.5 hours and finally the entire college crew came back to the University by 2:30 pm with a good understanding of Supply Chain and Operations Management of Hindustan Coca-Cola in Bidadi which is the franchisee of Coca-Cola industry in India.
