

The promotional stall, themed "Inside Out 2," aimed to raise awareness about mental health by fostering familiarity with emotions and how to manage them, highlighting how MACS creates such a supportive environment for students. Volunteers effectively explained the functions of each wing. Engaging activities included a heart puzzle, a PPT for freshers showcasing places to visit in Bangalore, and the Heads Up game. Master's Counseling students were also present to discuss pro-bono sessions available on campus. SESSION ON GENDER AND SEXUAL SENSITIVITY

27 JUNE 2024

The gender and sexuality sensitivity session, introduced by Vignesh, aimed to transform the department into a safe and inclusive space, in line with the Service Learning Cell's objectives. Participants engaged in activities to promote awareness and understanding of gender and sexuality. Shreya's Vocabulary Extravaganza differentiated between sex (biological category) and gender (socially constructed roles). Concepts intersexuality, asexuality, and deadnaming were explored. The Genderbread Person activity allowed participants to express their gender identities and discuss attraction, fostering personal reflections and group dialogue. The "You Soup" activity metaphorically addressed heteronormativity.

An interactive quiz by Deshna reinforced the discussed topics. The session highlighted the consequences of non-inclusivity and the regulatory prohibitions against discrimination, bullying, and ragging based on sexual orientation or gender identity. University resources like the ragging cell and counseling services were emphasized. The importance of social acceptance for connectedness well-being was underscored. The upcoming Prism event was highlighted for further promoting inclusivity. A Q&A session allowed for additional discussion. The session concluded with a commitment to ongoing education and supportive policies within the department. Participants left dedicated to fostering an inclusive environment and supporting diverse identities.



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
