Telesto is an annual International-level business fest hosted by Christ University's School of Business and Management, Bannerghatta Road Campus, designed for management students to tackle real-world corporate challenges. Held from October 7th to 9th, 2024 Telesto features events like Case Study, Multi-Tasking, and Business Quiz. The theme, "The Asimov Equation: Mankind's Last Stand," draws inspiration from Isaac Asimov's Foundation series, where humanity faces collapse. Participants, acting as humanity's last hope, must solve a hidden equation and make critical decisions to save civilization, guided by a mysterious Taskmaster inspired by Asimov's Second Foundation. Around 300 students participated from Different International and National Colleges.





The Department of Psychology's event began with the screening of 'The Intern' at 9:30 AM, focusing on the journey of 70-year-old Ben Whittaker, who, after finding retirement unfulfilling, decides to take up an internship at an online fashion store. Despite his boss's initial skepticism, Ben's calming presence and extensive life experience help transform the workplace into a less stressful environment.

His influence not only helps the CEO relax and feel more supported but also fosters a positive, collaborative work culture in the office. Following the screening, a panel discussion was moderated by Dr. Rijita Mukharjee. The panelists, Rathish Rana R, Pradyumn Sreenath Iyer, Dhriti Kirpalani (Third-year students), and Hari Krishna S (Second-year student), delved into key themes related to the intergenerational gap in the workplace. They highlighted the importance of mentorship in mental well-being, noting how older employees bring valuable experience that can guide the younger generation, while younger employees help older workers adapt to new technology.

The discussion also touched on the evolving mindset around mental health in the workplace, emphasizing the need for openness and support. Additionally, the panelists discussed work culture and the significance of work-life balance, stressing the value of creating an environment where hierarchy is balanced by humanity, openness, and opportunities for social learning. Intergenerational collaboration emerged as a vital point, with the panelists advocating for mutual respect and learning between generations to foster an inclusive and productive workplace. The event provided deep insights into navigating generational differences and building a more connected, mentally healthy workplace.

GUEST TALK- THE BOOK THAT I AM: WRITING A LITERARY MEMOIR AND ITS AFTERMATH

The CAPS (Centre for Academic & Professional Support) of CHRIST (Deemed to be University) organised a Session on 'Stress Management' on October 24, 2024, in Classroom 408 from 11AM to 12PM for the students of 3BAM&J of the Media Studies Department of CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bannerghatta Road Campus, Bangalore.

The session began with an elaboration on the concept of stress, defining it as the body's natural response to challenging situations. The speaker explained how stress, while a common part of life, can escalate into chronic stress if not managed, leading to physical and emotional health issues.

A key segment focused on the link between stress and panic attacks, explaining how prolonged stress can manifest in panic episodes, characterised by rapid heartbeat, dizziness, and shortness of breath. The importance of recognizing early symptoms was highlighted to prevent escalation. The session then introduced effective stress management strategies, emphasising time management, self-care, and healthy lifestyle habits. A demonstration of muscle relaxation techniques, such as progressive muscle relaxation, was conducted, showing participants how to release built-up tension in the body.

Finally, participants were encouraged to engage in regular physical exercise, meditation, and hobbies that bring joy as ways to release stress. Building strong social support networks was also stressed as an essential aspect of maintaining mental well-being. The session provided valuable insights and practical tools for managing stress effectively, contributing to participants' personal and professional well-being.
