

# ORIENTATION SESSION: PRIVILEGE STUDIES INTRODUCTION

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9th July, 2024

The session on privilege studies for the students of the Department of English and Cultural Studies delved into the multifaceted nature of privilege and disadvantage, emphasizing how social structures and context shape access and opportunities.

Participants explored how race, gender, disability, and socio-economic status influence daily experiences. An interactive activity had students imagine a day in a wheelchair, highlighting dependency and compromise. The concept of the academic wheel of privilege was introduced, illustrating how body size, career, and educational environments contribute to inequality. Personal anecdotes were shared, including one about joining Christ University to support a visually challenged friend and another about overcoming local domicile reservation.

Activities encouraged self-reflection on neurodiversity, physical ability, body size, religion, and language proficiency, fostering awareness of inherent biases. The session concluded with a call to recognize and understand the common-sense nature of privilege and its pervasive impact.

# Department of Psychology Sexual Health Sensitization session 16 July, 2024

The presentation entailed foundational knowledge of human anatomy with a key emphasis on nomenclature of different parts of the reproductive system. The speakers effectively conveyed the importance of communicating personal health information to healthcare professionals with a specification of the kind of professionals to approach for a cohort of concerns such as gynecologists, venereologists, etc. The session also spoke about the methods of contraception, their associated benefits and risks. Revolving around the same topic, the speakers distinguished sexually transmitted diseases infections by quoting well-known dysfunctions such as HIV and HPV. The first quotient of the session concluded with a mention of sexual dysfunction, its presentation and causes. The latter half of the session explored the concepts of consent, popular fads and the significance of verbal and non-verbal communication in navigating interpersonal situations involving consent and boundaries.

The presentation invoked case studies further to elucidate the process through which consent can be misguided or misinterpreted. The speakers then segued into the topic of digital consent communication and boundary-setting with an additional focus on pornography consumption and its implications. The topic invited the audience to be mindful of media and the intimate expectations that ensue from online sexual content. The orientation concluded with a dissemination of provisions made by the University on grounds of sexual harassment and abuse.

9th July 2024


